COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Wilderness Skills Field Course

This course is a skills course designed for the outdoor leader who wants to expand upon backcountry abilities and group management skills. The beauty of this course is that it's an abbreviated NOLS course that has a strong emphasis on skills. Your team of instructors will focus on such skills as packing and carrying a backpack, foot care, Leave No Trace camping, map reading, and more.

As a backcountry trip leader, you'll also gain knowledge in such areas as how to plan rations, or how to purchase gear in large quantities for whatever group you will be leading on expeditions of your own. If you want the ABC's of taking groups out into the hills-from youth organizations to social groups-this course is for you.

Wilderness First Aid

If you plan to spend time in the backcountry you need to be prepared. Fast paced and hands-on, this two-day course covers a wide range of wilderness medicine topics for people who travel and work in the outdoors. This course is pre-approved by such organizations as: the American Camping Association, the United States Forest Service, the US Coast Guard and other governmental agencies. It may also be used for wilderness medicine recertification by those with previous training. We recertify current cards from the following organizations only: WMI, NOLS, SOLO, and WMA.

Leave No Trace- Trainer Course

Get certified by Leave No Trace to teach youth and adults about minimal impact camping and ethical wilderness usage.

June 1-2 (begins 8:30am and ends afternoon June 2-participants must campout Friday evening with the group)

Flatwater Canoe Instructor – American Canoe Association

Learn how to teach youth and adults flatwater canoeing skills of maneuvering, paddle stroke, safety, and water dynamics. This course will have a test and certification. Participants will also have to pay for membership dues to ACA in order to maintain certification.

Health Care at Summer Camp-Myra Pravda

The unique role of the camp nurses will be explored in this workshop. Specific topics to be discussed will include: the role of the camp nurse as health care provider and educator, management of common health problems, communicable disease control, health screening, health forms, supplies and equipment for camp, medications at camp, communication with staff and parents, community resources, and resources for camp health professionals.

CHA- Certified Horsemanship Association

This standards certification clinic will focus on arena teaching and short trail rides. Includes demonstration lessons, classroom study, and written tests. Participants are evaluated by CHA certified clinicians and may receive auditors recognition, assistant instructor certification, or certification as an English and/or Western Instructor at one of the four horsemanship levels. Includes all materials, lodging, and meals.

Lifeguarding- American Red Cross

This ARC basic lifeguard training will include Professional Rescuer CPR and standard first aid. Participants are not guaranteed to pass.

Prerequisite: ability to swim 500 yards in combination of front crawl, backstroke, breaststroke, and side stroke.

Low Ropes / Initiative Training – ERi

Archery Instructor – National Archery Association

This Instructor Certification Course is sponsored by the NAA and is designed to qualify basic archery instructors for camps. Topics covered include setting up and operating a safe range and program, techniques for teaching youngsters to shoot, equipment needs, games, activities, awards, certifications, and more.

Outdoor Living Skills-American Camping Association

The Outdoor Living Skills (OLS) program was developed by the American Camping Association and is designed to teach youth and adults the outdoor skills needed for a meaningful outdoor experience with little or no impact on the environment. The program is comprised of 5 different levels (earth, sun, water, weather, and stars). Each level teaches skills in:

- map and compass reading
- preparing and planning a trip
- food preparation and storage
- knot tying
- first aid and safety
- environmental hazards
- basic ecology
- minimum-impact camping
- outdoor hazards
- weather
