#### COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

#### Wilderness Skills Field Course

This course is a skills course designed for the outdoor leader who wants to expand upon backcountry abilities and group management skills. The beauty of this course is that it's an abbreviated NOLS course that has a strong emphasis on skills. Your team of instructors will focus on such skills as packing and carrying a backpack, foot care, Leave No Trace camping, map reading, and more.

As a backcountry trip leader, you'll also gain knowledge in such areas as how to plan rations, or how to purchase gear in large quantities for whatever group you will be leading on expeditions of your own. If you want the ABC's of taking groups out into the hills-from youth organizations to social groups-this course is for you.

#### Wilderness First Aid

If you plan to spend time in the backcountry you need to be prepared. This course is pre-approved by such organizations as: the American Camping Association, the United States Forest Service, the US Coast Guard and other governmental agencies. It may also be used for wilderness medicine recertification by those with previous training. We recertify current cards from the following organizations only: WMI, NOLS, SOLO, and WMA.
